



Mougins Museum Ashmolean Scholarship

Further Particulars

This scholarship is made possible thanks to the generosity of Christian Levett and Wolfson College's Ancient World Research Cluster, and is offered in partnership with the Clarendon Fund.

Degree type and subject

The scholarship, offered in partnership with the Clarendon Fund, is open to applicants applying to undertake a 1-year Masters course with a focus on Greek material culture from 700 to 30BC.

Value of award

Course Fees and a grant for living costs for full-time students up to the UKRI Minimum Doctoral Stipend (£18,622 in 2023-24) pro-rata length of course for the duration of fee liability; part time students will receive a proportional study support grant. Where the scholar's course is less than 12 months, the stipend is pro-rata length of course. Previous Oxford students are advised to check their fee liability on the [University's Fees and Funding](#) pages for any applicable adjustments to fee liability resulting from prior study.

Partnership

The scholarship is offered in partnership with the Clarendon Fund.

How to apply

There is no separate application process. All applicants should apply to the University of Oxford under the [standard procedures](#) for graduate degrees for 2024-25. Applications should be made by the January deadline for your eligible course. If there are two or more candidates of equal academic merit, priority will be given to the candidate who has listed Wolfson as their first-choice college on their University application form. The Scholar will become a member of Wolfson College for the duration of their studies.
