

Oxford-Wolfson-Marriott-Graduate Scholarships 2025-26

Further Particulars

The Oxford Wolfson Marriott Scholarships have been made possible thanks to a generous donation to Wolfson College from the late Dr Francis Marriott, who was a University Lecturer and Fellow of Wolfson from 1970 until his death in 2012. Dr Marriott conducted research in the field of biomathematics and taught statistics. The scholarships are jointly-funded by the Oxford Graduate Scholarship Matched Fund.

Eligible degree subjects

Wolfson College will be offering Oxford Wolfson Marriott Scholarships in the following subjects for 2025-26 entry:

English

A scholarship for a DPhil in English, offered in partnership with the Faculty of English. Awarded at Home/ROI fee rate

• Computer Science

A scholarship for a DPhil in Computer Science, offered in partnership with the Department of Computer Science. Awarded at Home/ROI fee rate

Islamic Art and Architecture

A scholarship for an MSt or MPhil in Islamic Art and Architecture (with an intention to progress to the DPhil Asian & Middle Eastern Studies) <u>OR</u> direct entry to the DPhil Asian and Middle Eastern Studies, offered in partnership with the Faculty of AMES. *Awarded at Home/ROI fee rate*

Anthropology <u>OR</u> Migration Studies

A scholarship for a DPhil In Anthropology OR a DPhil in Migration Studies, offered in partnership with SAME. Awarded at either Home/ROI or Overseas fee rate.

The scholarships cover Course Fees (at the relevant fee rate listed above) and a grant for living costs (up to the UKRI Minimum Doctoral Stipend, which was £19,237 in 2024-2025). A student on a part-time course will receive a study support grant instead. Awards are made for the full duration of fee liability for the agreed course. The awards will be made in partnership with a number of departments, faculties and centres for doctoral training that may, exceptionally, enhance an award to bring it up to the Overseas Course Fee rate.

How to apply

There is no separate application process. Applicants, whether internal or external, should apply to the University of Oxford under the <u>standard procedures</u> for graduate degrees for 2025-26. Applications must be made by the January deadline for your chosen course and all eligible applications will be considered. If there are two or more candidates of equal academic merit, priority will be given to the candidate who has listed Wolfson as their first-choice college on the University application form. The successful scholar will become a member of Wolfson College for the duration of their studies.
